

Communication and Language

Listen attentively and respond to what they hear with relevant questions .
Express their ideas and feelings about their experiences using full sentences, including use of past, present and future tenses and making use of conjunctions, with modelling and support from their teacher.

Writing

Write recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed. Spell words by identifying sounds in them and representing the sounds with a letter or letters. Write simple phrases and sentences that can be read by others

Expressive arts and design

Experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function. Make use of props and materials when role playing characters in narratives and stories. Sing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs. Perform songs and move in time with music .

Mathematics

Have a deep understanding of number to 10. Subitise up to 5. Automatically recall number bonds up to 5 and some number bonds to 10, including double facts. Verbally count beyond 20. Compare quantities up to 10 in different contexts,. Explore and represent patterns within numbers up to 10.

Understanding the World

Understand the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books read in class and storytelling. Describe their immediate environment. Explore the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants .
